### **Biographical Sketches of SGS Reunion Speakers**

Dr. Dorothy A. Boyd-Rush has agreed to be the SGS Reunion after dinner speaker on Thursday and Friday evenings, 4 and 5 September 2003. Dr. Boyd-Rush is a professor of history at James Madison University. She has given innumerable presentations on both local history and genealogical research at national and regional conferences. She is a past president of the Virginia Genealogical Society, currently a Governor at Large for VGS, a former book review editor for the Association of Professional Genealogists' Quarterly and a partner in Lots Wife Publishing Company, Staunton, Virginia. Her most recent genealogical publications include: Register of Free Blacks: Virginia, 1807-1859 Rockingham County, (Heritage Books); Marriage Notices from Extant Issues of the Rockingham Register, Harrisonburg, Virginia, 1822-1870 (Heritage Books); and, Registers of Free Negroes, Botetourt County, Virginia, 1802-1836 (Iberian Publishing Company). She is also a frequent contributor to both of the publications of the Virginia Genealogical Society, i.e., the newsletter and the Magazine of Virginia Genealogy. Dr. Boyd-Rush is also an instructor at the annual Virginia Institute of Genealogical Research (Richmond, Virginia).

#### **REUNION TOURS**

As the reunion gets closer it is time to start thinking about the some of the sights to be seen in the "Historic Virginia Triangle." Due to the ever-changing national security threat levels, it's impossible to plan a trip to the Navy bases which regulate admission to their facilities based on these threat levels. He is a 13th generation Virginian, born in 1947 in Norfolk. He graduated from the College of William and Mary in 1969 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English Literature. He was a public school teacher and is now a computer programmer/analyst employed by the Federal government in Norfolk, Virginia. Mr. Moore is married to Catherine Lucille Pies of Cincinnati, Ohio, and has two grown stepdaughters. He and his wife live less then a mile from his great-grandfather's farm and great great-grandfather's family cemetery. Mr. Moore gained practical experience as an amateur genealogist researching his paternal line to 1656 in Lower Norfolk County, Virginia. In 1996, he completed American Genealogy: A Basic Course, and in 1999 became a Certified Genealogical Record Specialist. He is a graduate of the National Institute of Genealogical Research (2000), the Virginia Institute on Genealogical Research (2001), and the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research (2002). Mr. Moore has served as Governor-at-Large (2001-2003), associate newsletter editor (2002-), and Vice President (2003-2005) of the Virginia Genealogical Society; Deputy Registrar of the Virginia Society, Order of the Founders and Patriots of America (2001-); and President of the Virginia Beach Genealogical Society (2002-2003). Mr. Moore is the owner of Antecedents® LLC, a genealogical and family history research business. He is a member of the National Genealogical Society, the Virginia Genealogical Society, the Virginia Beach Genealogical Society, and the Association of Professional Genealogists. Martha Usnick (<u>FEUSNICK@cs.com</u>) had asked for information on an **Anna Seely**, b. 24 Feb. 1809, and d. 1863 in Farmersville, NY. She had information on Anna's children and husband (John Nichols) but couldn't locate Anna's parents. Ruth S. Johnson has identified Anna as likely to be SGS #1089 in the Nathaniel line. This Anna is the youngest dau. of Benjamin Seelye and Olive Rood, aged 12 in 1820. Two of Anna's brothers lived just west of Farmersville, one of her children is a Benjamin and another is named Ormus, the name of a cousin who lived near Anna's parents. **SGS Interim Response:** I tentatively identified Mima as **Jemima Seely**, SGS # 1798, dau. of James Seely and Nancy Westlake in the Obadiah line as shown in the Sixth Generation SGS publication. Dan Seelye agreed that this matched his information. If anyone is related to this line please contact June to share information.

#### SEELEY DNA PROJECT UPDATE

The objective of this test is to help determine how close a relationship there is between Nathaniel (1627-1675) son of Robert and Obadiah Seeley (cr. 1614-1657). Previous research hasn't proven a direct relationship between the two. Males who can trace their ancestry back to a son of Nathaniel or Obadiah are potential donors. The sample kit is a simple swab that is used to take a sample from the inside of the mouth and then sent to the lab. As reported in previous newsletters, there have been several samples sent to the lab already. Some test results have been received from the lab, however not enough to make a determination.

We still do not have donors for the following lines:

On the Nathaniel line we don't have donors for Robert #6 and Joseph #8.

On the Obadiah line we still don't have a donor for Cornelius # 18.

I made a series of rubbings there in 1972 and while there had a chance to learn something about it's history. . . . and no history of St. Olave's in Hart Street would be complete. . ." without some notes about the eminent Diarist, Samuel Pepys, Esq., Secretary to the Admiralty". Samuel and Elizabeth Pepys became parishioners there on July 17, 1660. Both are buried and have memorials there. Of possible interest to our SGS members is the fact that the church was probably first built before the end of the 13th century. It was destroyed and rebuilt a couple of times but the present church is said to have been constructed by Richard and Robert Cely about the middle of the 15th century. An interesting description of the church is contained in Charles Dickens's "Uncommercial Traveler." It deals principally with the churchyard of St. Ghastly
