

Jim Seeley, our Past President, is the chair of the committee to nominate candidates for the SGS Executive Board election in 2009. Ruthetta Hansen and Ramon Hall are serving with him. The slate of officers has been determined. Thanks to all who have agreed to serve. The Board established a DNA Testing Assistance Fund. There are times when testing DNA is perhaps of more interest to the Society than it is to the individual involved. The cost of DNA testing could be prohibitive to some of our members and others. I encourage members of SGS to contribute to this fund by sending a donation for this fund to Sally Seeley, SGS Treasurer. The committee is working on criteria for SGS providing assistance.

More testing of males with the Seeley surname and with documented lineage to one of the immigrants, Robert or Obadiah, is needed to determine more than one generation from the DNA. Also we need those of the Seeley surname and documented lineage to other immigrants, such as those from the Isle of Shoals, to be tested. If you or someone else you know is willing to undergo the test, go to the web page set up by our DNA Lineage Project Manager, Ken McCrea, http://SeeleyDNA.info/SignUp.htm. The process now costs about \$125 per test.

The preservation of SGS documents, both those shelved at the Seelye Research Center and in my home, in the event of an emergency, is a concern for SGS. The importance of scanning documents into electronic format so they can be protected and shared has been discussed by the elected and appointed officers.

There is always work to be done at the Seelye Research Center in Abilene, Kansas. A group of us will be gathering on Thursday, April 30 until Saturday, May 2 to sort and file material concerning Seeley family members. We will also have time for some fun. You are certainly welcome to join us! Please let me know if you are planning to come.

Filing and Much More Going On at the Seelye Research Center

The indexing and scanning of the obituaries that were on file at the Seelye Research Center have been completed and copies of the obituaries have been sent to Chris Havnar for inclusion in the website. So don't forget to check out the website.

Also a decision has also been made regarding the scanning (digitizing) of our papers. My original hope was that we would eventually be able to scan our documents and then be able to search them; but after researching what was involved I realized that was not feasible. So. we will be scanning our source documents for the SGS number lines first and then continue on from there, with the purpose of making sure we have copies of the documents for protection and accessibility.

Because we will not be able to search our scanned documents. I will be adding information to our 8th generation index to allow us to find documents easier. Look for the update to this index on the website after our May filing session.

A Librarian's Research Tip: Since the New Year has begun and many of you will be getting back to research projects, may I suggest you visit your hometown library? Many libraries have programs to teach you how to do genealogy research along with contact information for local societies that might be able to help you out. Not only does my library have a sizable research area, they also have subscriptions to various on-line databases that can be accessed from home with a library card. Most of the services are free and the people in the library really like to help you out. So check your local library, it's a great place to get started.

Update and Research News from SeeleySociety.net Webmaster

We've been pretty busy, but most of our work has been invisible to. We had performed a lot of housekeeping activities, regrouping files into separate folders.

We have continued to add obituaries. Currently we have 952 Seeley obituaries, 583 Seely obituaries, and 149 Seelye obituaries.

We have added a Weddings Collection. These are newspaper articles about marriages at least 50 years in the past. Currently most of the entries are from New York newspapers. The entries are broken into Brides and Grooms listing by each last name group.

Of note to internet genealogy researchers interested in Northern California, many of the records of San Francisco's Halsted N. Gray, Carew and English Mortuary are available online.

The earliest records are now available for free at FamilySearch. This is a major database for pre-1906 records! The search index is only partially done, but the images are available.

SFgenealogy.com has also completed the first phase of indexing the Halsted Mortuary Records database on its site. Accessible for free, the database includes digitized images of over 45,000 mortuary records, along with a searchable index, for the years 1923 to 1960.

This is a particular boon for researchers. Due to the 1906 earthquake and subsequent fire, many official vital records in the city and county of San Francisco were destroyed. Prior to the donation of these records by the Halsted N. Gray, Carew and English Mortuaries, researching was restricted to newspaper mentions. directories, and census records.

Presidential Airlift, Logistics, and Communications The 89th Airlift Wing and Chief Master Sergeant Robert Sealey

On Jan. 20, 2009, millions of Americans watched as the 44th President of The United States, Barack Obama was sworn in.

There are a number of Seeley links to the White House and the Presidency. Architectural Historian William Seale is the author of *The President's House: A History; The White House: Actors and Observers;*

and *The White House: The History of an American Idea*. He also serves as the editor of the White House Historical Association's journal *White House History*.

Ron and Mary Evans Seeley own the most extensive collection of White House and presidential memorabilia in the nation.

And Chief Master Sergeant Robert L. Sealey is the Command Chief Master Sergeant for the 89th Airlift Wing, Andrews Air Force Base, Md. widely known as the unit that transports the President onboard Air Force One.

With a combat-ready force of more than 1,000 Airmen, the 89th Airlift Wing provides global Special Air Mission (SAM) airlift, logistics, aerial port and communications for the President, Vice President, Combat Commanders, senior leaders and the global mobility system as tasked by the White House, Chief of Staff of the Air Force and Air Mobility Command. The 89th Airlift Wing maintains 24/7 alert, operating the Executive Airlift Training Center and Government Network Operation Center.

As the Command Chief Master Sergeant, Sealey is the principle advisor to the wing commander on matters influencing the health, morale, welfare, readiness and effective utilization of all enlisted members of the Wing.

Additionally, as the Wing's senior enlisted leader, Sealey serves as a role model and mentor for junior



Airmen.

"There is no doubt leadership is the most important concept that governs our life in the military," said Seeley in a recent editorial. "The training of strong

leadership qualities within our personnel has always been a hallmark of the American military tradition; but it is passion, when focused through the prism of vision, that ignites those qualities and traits into action."

Sealey advises up-and-coming Air Force leaders to "always remember that leadership is a gift, and it's given by those who follow. So be worthy of the honor and exercise it with a vision-focused passion."

Sealey was born in 1966 in Zanesville, Ohio and graduated from Zanesville High school in 1984. He enlisted in the Air Force in December 1986 and completed basic military training, security police technical training, and air base defense training at Lackland AFB in June 1987. He is a USAF-level recipient of the prestigious Lance P. Sijan Leadership Award and deployed as the Security Forces Manager for the 386th Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

What Do We Know About Obadiah Seeley?

There is considerable evidence that the immigrant Obadiah Seeley who appeared in Stamford, Conn. records in the 1640's is the same Obadiah Seeley who was born in Birmingham, England in 1614, but the considerable evidence we have is circumstantial. There is no "smoking gun" that we've found so far to solidly connect the two. Obadiah Seeley's associations with people in England and America may shed

light on what little we know about Obadiah's immigrating to America. This article discusses some of those associations.

An Obadiah Seeley was christened at St Martins, in Birmingham, Warwickshire, England according to a research report by certified genealogist Frederick C. Hart, Jr.. When he was between two and three, his brother Samuel died, and his mother Alice/Alyce died (probably as a complication of childbirth of twin girls, Mary and Elizabeth). When he was six, his sister Sarah Seeley married Obadiah Bruen.

When Obadiah Seeley was twelve he was living in London as a servant and later an apprentice for Nehemiah Wallington, a second generation Puritan. We know from Wallington's writing that Obadiah was there in 1625 until at least 1635 when he completed his apprenticeship. This is the last recorded date of Obadiah Seeley in England that we know of.

"Obediah (sic) Seele son of William Seeley, Birmingham in the County of Warwickshire, draper, [apprenticed to] Nehemihe [sic] Wallington for 9 years from the feast of St Michael Archangel last." This entry is dated 11th January 1626/7 and the fee of 2s 6d is recorded as having been paid.²

During the time he was living in the Wallington household he was treated like a family member as was customary of Wallington who lived out his life in the tiny parish of St. Leonard's Eastcheap a few dozen yards north of London Bridge. The Wallingtons remained in London during the plague of 1625.

Nehemiah Wallington was a London Puritan artisan whose long life (1598-1658) left almost no discernible impact on his time. Yet he was nevertheless in almost every respect an exceptional Englishman. During this era of high mobility many Englishmen moved sometimes great distances in search of work, of better economic prospects, or of means to escape from religious persecution.

Wallington drew up a list of "31 articles for my family for the reforming our lives," to which the adult members of the family "set our hands." Besides the signatures of Nehemiah and Grace, the document contained that of the apprentice, James Weld, and the three servants—

Obediah Seeley, Theophilus Ward, and Susan Pate. Such a document suggests that Wallington tended to see "family" as simply another term for "household."

Wallington was admitted as a Master by the Turner's Company in 1620. Between 1610 and 1620 the Turners Company bound some 265 apprentices. Only 8.3% during that period seem to have been London born so it is not too unusual then for Obadiah to be from as far away as Warwickshire.

Obadiah and Slawsons/Slawsons.

Within the guild system, the turners were prevented from expanding into the larger trade in wooden household furniture by the jurisdictional boundaries of the more powerful Joiners' Company, on the one side, and the construction business by the even more powerful Carpenters, on the other. In fact after 1630 they would have been fined "a 10/fine each week."

Wallington mentions many trips across the London Bridge to the Southwark area. Because of Nehemiah's trade, both Obadiah and Wallington could have become familiar with the Slawsons of Southwark, Surrey.

We don't know if Obadiah Seeley crossed the Thames into Surrey to become a carpenter. But, when Obadiah first came to Stamford, Conn. he built John Miller's house. This would give weight to his learning house building skills in England before he came to Stamford where he was not bound by the woodcraft guilds of London.

It is possible that Obadiah formed a connection to Millers, Slawsons and/or Angells. Obadiah's associations in Stamford included the Slawsons. George Slasson/Slawson, the son of Richard and Anne Angell Slawson was born in Southwark, Surrey, England about 1615. He was in America by 1637 and married in Stamford in 1642. His home was adjacent to Obadiah's in Stamford.

Obadiah Seeley's Connection to the Bruen Family

A Guildhall manuscript lists Obadiah's father, William of Birmingham, as a draper. There is a likely connection between William, a draper and his daughter Sarah's husband Obadiah Bruen of Shropshire, near Warwickshire. Obadiah Bruen became a draper at Shrewsbury in 1633.⁴

The Bruen family of Bruen-Stapleford in Cheshire is well documented in *The Bruen Family Collection*⁵ and Obadiah and Sarah Seeley Bruen were in Shrewsbury in Salop/Shropshire in 1634, when their first child, Mary was baptized at Saint Julian 12 June 1634.

It is speculated that Obadiah Seeley could have come to the Piscataqua area with Obadiah Bruen and Obadiah Seeley's sister Sarah in 1635 when he was released from his apprenticeship. In 1635, Obadiah Bruen purchased property in the Shrewsbury Patent in Piscataqua, now known as Stratham Maine. In 1640 he sold his property and moved to Gloucester, now Mass.

Richard Percival, one of the Shrewsbury (Eng) men

who received a patent from the crown for lands at Dover and vicinity sold his share May 4, 1640, to Obediah Bruen. Though Obadiah and Sarah Bruen settled in New London, Obadiah Bruen's half-sister Mary married John Baldwin and lived in Stamford Conn. Bruen's daughter Hannah also married a Baldwin and lived in Stamford where Obadiah Seeley is recorded as owning land.

With John Underhill in England and New England

John Underhill was another who could have been an associate in Warwickshire, England and Stamford. He came from Warwickshire, England as did an Obadiah Seeley. Underhill migrated in 1630 to Piscataqua (now known as Boston and Exeter) He was paid for military service 1630; Deputy from 1631 – 1634, removed to Dover. He was also granted land and taxed in Stamford Oct. 1642. In 1643 he was associated with George Slawson, [Obadiah's neighbor] in Stamford.⁷

James Cole

Nehemiah Wallington mentions his friend James Cole several times according to the book *Wallington's World* by Paul S. Seaver. In August or September 1634, Cole was writing from Warwickshire. Wallington corresponded with Cole after he came to New England in 1640. Cole settled in Hartford, Conn.

Did Obadiah Seeley marry John Miller's wife in 1642 shortly after Miller died? In the ancient town records it is recorded: "In reassessing the situation in Stamford after the large Long Island group, one finds that of the fifty-nine men that arrived in 1641 and 1642 there remained only twenty-eight. These founding men were remarkably

hardy, for in spite of toil and turmoil, only one of their number died during these early year. John Miller, who had arrived in 1642, died that same year. His wife married Obadiah Seely *shortly thereafter*, and his three young sons, John, Jonathan, and Joseph grew up in the Seely household."

Passenger List

On a final note, Obadiah Seeley was found in a Passenger and Immigration Index 1500s -1900s, place Connecticut, 1642; listed as primary immigrant, permanent entry number 1019185, source publication number 260.9

Update to Query 0102-1 Re: Samuel Seeley b. 1810 PA

Debbie Kempf (skempf@erols.com) had contacted us about the lineage of her g-g-grandmother Nancy Jane Seeley Mangus, born 1840 Blair County, PA whose death certificate named her parents as Samuel Seeley b. Crawford Co. PA and Catherine Benner. We had reported that we didn't have information on this couple. In researching the ancestors of Richard J Seeley who died in 2008 in Johnstown, PA I found Samuel and Catherine in the 1850, 1860 and 1870 censuses. They were in

Wheatfield, Indiana, PA in 1850, in Jenner, Somerset, PA in 1860 and in Millville, Cambria, PA in 1870. Their children include Nancy age 9 in 1850 and age 18 in 1860. We do not know the lineage of this Samuel Seeley. Please contact me if you recognize this couple or any of their relatives.

Update to Query 0108-1 Re: Henry S Seeley

Henry S Seeley resided Poughkeepsie NY in 1880 (census) and 1885 when his daughter Minnie married George J. Miller (wedding announcement). Paul Northrup Miller (millers@albany.net), the submitter, had placed Henry in the family of William and Sally Seeley of Stanford, Dutchess, NY (1850 census). Our response in 2001 was that this William could be William Henry Seely b. 1803 Carmel, Putnam Co. NY.

Further research has shown that William Henry is a son of William Henry Seely SGS# 3174 and his wife was named Mary Ann, not Sally.

I found burial records for Stanfordville, Dutchess, NY. William Seeley died 20 Aug 1878 age 75 yr-4 mo-20 days. In the same cemetery are 4 children of William and Sally Seeley who died as young children named Harrison, Victoria, Willie J and Sylvanus B. (7 additional children were identified from census records as well as Minnie's brothers and sisters). Also in the same cemetery are Sylvanus Seeley who died 27 March 1835 age 59-2-

19 and Sarah Seeley, wife of Sylvanus Jr. who died 29 June 1847 age 41-9-14. It seems likely that William was the son of Sylvanus Seeley Jr b. Feb 1776.

Who is this Sylvanus? Is he the father of William?

Update to Query 0808-1 Re: Louis Seeley

In the last issue we published an update to this query identifying the father and uncle of Louis Seeley as Augustus and Philip Seeley, sons of James Seeley and his 2nd wife Mary/Polly Servos/Serviss. James is a son of Augustus Seeley the UE Loyalist. Bill Lavery (lavery@nrtco.net) sent us a record from the 1901 Canadian census giving Philip's birth date:

Update to Query 0811-3 re: Franklin B. Seeley b. 1884 PA

The original query was submitted by Butch Willsey (awillsey@stny.rr.com).

We had found census records for Frank L. Seeley b. Feb 1884 PA, married to Pearl Little 1913 and residing in Tioga Co. PA. He is with his mother Mary Seely age 37, married 19 years and sister Polly (18?) in the 1900 census of Jackson, Tioga, PA living as boarders in the home of Samuel Marvin. We suggested that perhaps he was a son of Elias Seely, son of Chester and Polly Alvord Seely. Chester is SGS# 2645.

We received an email from Anne P. Lugg (aelugg@penn.com) stating that Elias died in 1885/6 and although he was married to Mary Davis they had no children. Mary Davis Seely was remarried in 1890 to Theodore Pierce and they had several children. Anne's information is from Mary's grand-daughter by her 2nd husband.

I found a WWI Draft Reg'n for Frank Lee Seely of Tioga Co. PA b. 5 Feb. 1884.

J. Kelsey Jones has information on Tioga County Seeleys on Joyce Tice's Tri-Counties website. He shows a Franklin Seeley born to Benjamin F Seeley and his wife Mary L Burrows (married 1880 Chemung Co NY). Benjamin married a 2nd time (in 1905 according to 1910 census) Anna Louise Rowe.

Looking again at our database I found entries for Franklin or Franklin B Seeley as a son of Benjamin Franklin Seeley and Mary L Burrows. Then I found BF Seeley in the 1900 census of Jackson, Tioga, PA, md 19 years with 4 children: Anna 12, Elmer 11, Will 7 and Jennie 4. Note that Mary his wife is in the same town with two other children. Did they divorce?

Can anyone find evidence that Franklin, son of Benjamin F is the same man as Frank Lee Seeley b. Feb 1894?

Tom contacted us about Edward F. Seeley, born July 1852, in Michigan (Genesee county?), married Frances C Freeman (born Sept 1952, NY) on Sept. 13, 1872 in East Saginaw, MI. The 1900 census states that they had 4 children living with them in June 1900. The youngest of the four was Tom's grandfather Reu Seeley. He was born July 1886 according to the census. Reu L Seeley and Bertha M Kile were married on June 27, 1911 in Flint MI. However Tom cannot find any records at all for Edward F. Seeley's ancestors. All he can tell from the 1900 census is that Edward was born in MI and his father was born in KY and his mother in MI.

SGS Response: From Wikipedia: Seely's Basin

Future Dayton Mayor and son-in-law of William A. Huffman, Morris Seely, had Seely's Basin built in 1832. The canal, first known as Seely's Basin, then Seely's folly, Seely's ditch, the old ditch, and now as " the ditch." was an enterprise intended by Mr. Seely to benefit the property through which it ran. The water was taken from the canal at the east side of Wayne street. immediately at the bridge, then running south along the east side of Wayne to near Lodwick street (Fifth), southeasterly across Lodwick to Simpson street, and east along the north side of Simpson, crossing Plum and Pearl streets where a basin was formed extending up to Lodwick street (Fifth). From Simpson street, the race led south between Mad River and Pearl streets. crossing Wayne at Richard street and following its present course to Warren street and to the old basin at the Fair Ground

Mr. Seely's vision was that property along this race, especially where wharves and docks could be constructed, would be greatly enhanced in value.

One of the items on Larry's website is an 1818 land transaction by Morris Seely of Benton, Ontario (now Yates) Co. NY. I located many (11) transmitted deeds there but none linked Morris to another Seely. The only other Seelys listed were Rachel (1 transaction), Samuel S. (2) and Schofield (1).

Morris Seely married Catherine Huffman in 1827. He died before the 1850 census. If you have any information about Morris Seeley please contact me.

Query 0902-3 submitted by Lynn Davis (Lklem01@comcast.net)

Lynn is doing research and is curious about Euphemia/Affa/Effie Seeley, SGS# 2274. She needs proof that her father was Abner Seeley, SGS# 816. According to our information, Euphemia was born in New Milford, Litchfield, Connecticut on 23 Jan 1793. However, while New Milford does have records of other Seeley children born to Abner Seeley and Eunice Smith, they do not have records of the birth of Euphemia or Affa or Effie Seeley.

SGS Response: Euphemia appears as Effie Ferdon age 56, born CT in the 1850 census of Callicoon, Sullivan, NY with her husband Zachariah Ferdon, a farmer age 66 and born in NY. Listed with them are Anthony H. Ferdon age 22, Seth Ferdon age 18, Harriet Ferdon age 11 and Eunice Seely age 21, all born NY. According to the SGS database this Eunice Seely is a daughter of David Seelye and his first wife Mary Bonk. We have David Seelye, SGS# 2277, listed as a brother of Euphemia/Effie.

Does anyone have proof that Abner Seeley is Euphemia's father or can you place her in another family?

RESEARCH QUERIES

Research Query 2008-A Cyrus Seeley md to Eliza S Ross of Monroe and Orleans Co. NY

I found the short bio below while researching something else... I was able to find quite a bit of info on John R Seeley and his siblings, all children of Cyrus and Eliza S (Ross) Seeley. However I can't track down anything definite on Cyrus' ancestry - just some clues - see below.

From Landmarks of Orleans County, New York by Isaac Smith Signor, Henry Perry Smith 1894, p. 92-3

Seeley, John K. was born in Cattaraugus County July 26 1836 and is a son of Cyrus and Eliza S Seeley. He has three sisters, the youngest, Mrs PM Hayford came to Holley in 1878, where she now resides. She had three daughters and one son. His brother, Anson J Seeley, at our country's call in 1861 enlisted. He served his country two years, was taken prisoner and sent to Andersonville where he died in 1863. John R Seeley came from Monroe County in 1864 and settled in Murray where he is a farmer. For several years during his early residence here he taught school. He is a member of the A.O.U.W. of Holley. In 1861 Mr Seeley married Pauline Reed, daughter of Daniel W. and Electa Reed of Murray. They are both members of the Baptist Church of Holley.

(*The John K seems to be a typo - see data below*) Andersonville Prison Records (US Parks Service Civil War Soldiers and Sailors):

Seeley, Anson J.: Private in 140 New York Infantry – Company A. He was captured 26 May 1864 at Bethesda Church, VA.

However Cyrus didn't die in 1837 since I found Cyrus Seeley and Eliza in the 1830 census of Greece, Monroe, NY; 1840 census of Clarkson, Monroe, NY; 1850 Greece, Monroe, NY,; 1860 Murray, Orleans, NY; and 1870 Clarkson, Monroe, NY. Eliza is a widow living with daughter Phoebe Hayford in Holley, Orleans, NY in 1880. From census records the children of Cyrus and Eliza are Anson J. b. 1829, Esther S. b. 1834, John R. b. 1837, Phebe M b. 1840, Charles b. 1850. There is another dau. age 5-10 in the 1840 census. The census always has Cyrus b. NY.

In 1870 Martha E and Annie E Way are living with Cyrus and Eliza.

With all this information I am supposing that Cyrus may be a grandson of Nathaniel Seeley, SGS# 601. Bennett Seeley (SGS# 1908) is in the 1830 and 1840 censuses of Clarkson, Monroe, NY. Perhaps he is an uncle of Cyrus. There is one record on Familysearch.org indicating a Cyrus b. to Anson Seeley (SGS 1907?) but there are no sources. As you can see the Justus Seeley md to Sarah Sheldon named a son Cyrus and lived in the same area. Could he be a brother of Cyrus?

Your query will also be posted on our website. Make sure we have your current contact details — sometimes we get new information months or even years after your query appears.

If you have information to share on queries from current or past issues, send it to the query submitter and also to Linda Crocker, Query Editor. Please include the Query number, preferably in the subject line of your email. Remember to cite your sources.

WHAT'S NEW IN QUERIES

We have decided to separate queries into those coming from members or the public and those that we generate ourselves as we research leads we find in biographies and obituaries, etc. These latter Research Queries will come after the regular queries in the newsletter and will be printed on a space available basis. They will be identified by their year of origin and a letter. Any that are left out because of space limitations will get 1st priority in the next newsletter. This is part of our continuing effort to identify as many Seeley lineages as possible.
