THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

DNA PROJECT STATUS REPORT

As reported in the last Newsletter, Anita Lustenberger, a certified Genealogist has agreed to work with the SGS on structuring the DNA testing program so as to determine if there is a genetic link between Robert Seeley (Nathaniel) and Obadiah Seeley. Three members, Jim Seeley, Dan Seelye and Montell Seeley have agreed to participate; however Ms. Lustenberger feels that we should identify four from the two lines of descendancy from Nathaniel and Obadiah as indicated below. The purpose of this project is to try to determine how close the relationship is between descendants of Nathaniel (1627-1675) known son of Robert and Obadiah (about 1614-1657). For this purpose, DNA testing analyses the Y-chromosome, which is from the male line. This test result is sometimes referred to as a signature that can be compared to others. The test lab that we are using is Oxford Ancestors Limited, Killington, United Kingdom. Some samples have been sent to the lab, however we need more volunteers as indicated below.

Male volunteers who can trace their ancestry back to one of the male ancestors listed below are encouraged to volunteer. Each volunteer is encouraged to donate half the testing cost (\$100), and the Seeley Genealogical Society will pay the remainder. PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

A committee chaired by Katherine Olsen, and consisting of Walter Davis and Ray Hall was appointed by the SGS President, Jim Seeley, to draft proposed revisions to the Constitution and Bylaws of the Society. In the November 2002 SGS Newsletter, proposed changes to the Society's Constitution and Bylaws were published. Comments were received concerning the addition to the Bylaws of Section 14. The following revision incorporates the comments received. A complete summary of changes to be proposed at the 2003 Reunion will be published in final form in the May 2003 Newsletter.

Add

Section 14. A membership chairperson, responsible for the promotion of the Society <u>membership</u> shall be appointed by the President from the Executive Board exclusive of the Treasurer. (This would make the Membership Chairman a collateral duty of any member of the Executive Board except the Treasurer. The Treasurer is excluded to assure independence in handling of SGS funds.)

Martha Seeley of McLean, VA, died February 20, 2002 at her home in McLean after a long illness. She was one of the founding partners of West Group. She was born in Mexico City in 1918, the youngest of four children born to Dr. Sidney and Ethel H. Ulfelder. A surgeon, her father helped to found the American British Coudrey Hospital in Mexico City. Her first husband, John N. Poto died in Portugal in 1943 while

serving in the U.S. Army. She married Col. Rudolph G. Seeley in 1949. Together they developed the West Gate and West Park office parks. Mrs. Seeley is survived by her two daughters; Julie of Falls Church and Maggie of San Diego, CA.; her son Jack of Great Falls; four grandchildren and three greatgrandchildren.

Theresa M. "Althea" Wilson died August 27, 2002 at the age of 92 in the Lutheran Retirement Home. She was born February 19, 1910, in Randolph, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alton Seeley. <u>Update to Query # 0105-10 Re The Two William and Two Samuel Problem</u> The submitters were Tere Seeley, Email <u>tjseeley@plantationcable.net</u>, and Jim Seeley, Email <u>jrseeley@aol.com</u>. (Please note Tere's new Email address.) J. Kelsey Jones, Email <u>Montrose@npacc.net</u>, has provided Tere, Jim, and SGS with some info on the William who lived in Wells Township of Bradford County, PA. This William is probably Tere's ancestor and J. Kelsey Jones believes he may possibly be the son of Nathaniel Seeley and Jemima Collins. The other William lived, and is buried, in neighboring Ridgebury Township of the same County and his parentage is also unproven. What we don't know, for sure, are the parents of the two Williams. The two Williams were born in the 1783 to 1792 timeframe and are listed in the SGS Publications as SGS # 1595 and SGS # 1692. Darlene was seeking info on the descendants of Jesse Seeley who is possibly the son of SGS # 1993 David Seeley and Ursula Sweetman. The SGS response in the May Newsletter listed Jesse Seeley and Prudence Brown's 15 children. This Ruth Seely is listed as b. 1828, d. 1890, m. 18 Feb 1852, Benjamin Franklin Dunning (b. 1819; d. 1896), son of Benjamin Dunning. Dan Seelye provided Danielle a Group Sheet on this Ruth Seely. The second Ruth Seely listed in the *Seventh Generation Families* is SGS # 3877 and she is the daughter of Selah Tuthill Seely (SGS # 1751) a brother of Albert (SGS # 1746). This Ruth is listed as b. 3 Sep 1848 and m. Frank Dunning, resided in New York City, NY. The 3 SGS Publications contain much more information on Ruth Seelys' ancestors.
