# Research Report on Obadiah Seeley, 22 JULY 2006

Research Objective: Help SGS identify the ancestors in England of Obadiah Seeley who died in Stamford, CT on 25 August 1657.

This report discusses the results of the research objectives described in my research outline dated 27 April 2006. The results were largely unproductive. No additional evidence of any real value was found, although I am still waiting for a response from the Staffordshire Record Office on one outstanding search. Each of the ten searches is discussed below in the order in which they appear in the 27 April research outline.

Search for the Will of William Seeley in Areas Surrounding Birmingham (England).

Previous research did not find the will of William Seeley of Birmingham in the published calendars of the Consistory Court of Lichfield or the Perogative Court of Canterbury. The search was now expanded to surrounding jurisdictions. Birmingham, which is in Warwickshire, lies only a few miles from Staffordshire and Worcestershire. Hence, a move by William Seeley of only a few miles could put him in a different probate jurisdiction. Moreover, there are many minor courts known as "Peculiars" within the three counties of Warwickshire, Staffordshire, and Worcestershire. During this research session, all the probate courts for the threecounty area were examined for Seeley wills and administrations except for the Consistory Court of Hereford which embraces a small area of western Worcestershire a considerable distance Birmingham. The will calendars and indexes were examined only for the period 1636 (when William was last known to be living in Birmingham) and 1670. Some of the peculiar courts do not have records prior to 1670 and were therefore not examined. The following records were searched:

- Calendar of Wills and Administrations in the Peculiar Jurisdictions in the Diocese of Lichfield. This calendar embraces 23 peculiar courts, mostly in Staffordshire. No Seeley or variants were found.
- Calendar of Wills in the Consistory Court of the Bishop of Worcester, 1601-1652.
   John Seely of Honnington, husbandman, will 1631.<sup>1</sup>

- Calendar of Wills and Administrations in the Episcopal Consistory Court of Worcester, 1661-1699.
   John Sealey of Bearley, will 10 Sept 1667.<sup>2</sup>
- Index to Peculiar Court of Hartlebury (Worcs.)
   No Seeley or variants found.
- Index to Peculiar Court of Fladbury (Worcs.)
   No Seeley or variants found.
- Index to Peculiar Court of the Rector of Hanbury No Seeley or variants found.
- Wills and Administrations in the Court of Delegates, London
  - This is an appellate court for other jurisdictions. No Seeley or variants found.
- Index of Cases in the Records of the Court of Arches, London
  - This is an appellate court for other jurisdictions. No Seeley or variants found.
- Perogative Court of Canterbury.

Although this court was previously searched, the index has now been made available on line in an easy-to-use searchable format. The following PCC wills were noted:

William Selye or Seely, merchant of Clopton, Suffolk, 16 May 1655.

William Seely, gentleman of Rushmere, Suffolk, 27 June 1659.<sup>3</sup>

# President's Report by Jim Seeley

As I write this, negotiations are still underway for a hotel to host the 2007 SGS Reunion. Visiting the area brought back pleasant memories of the SGS Reunion held there in 1992. This area is considerably more expensive than Abilene, Williamsburg, or Tacoma, sites of our last three reunions. Comments from the 2005 reunion attendees indicated a number of members preferred one location where we could stay, meet, and eat. This approach would make it much easier for those of us who aren't as spry on their feet as they used to be. It has been suggested that we stay in a less expensive hotel, eat in a number of close by restaurants, and meet at a rented site. This might be a little less expensive but not significantly so. Hopefully negotiations with a Wethersfield, CT area hotel, with restaurant and meeting facilities, will make it both affordable and less stressful on attending all the functions.

SGS has spent \$884.32 on research this year to learn the ancestors in England of Obadiah Seeley who died in Stamford, CT in 1657. DNA test results show he was not related to immigrant Robert Seeley. See researcher Clifford L. Stott's final report in this Newsletter.

John Seely and I attended the FGS/NEHGS conference in Boston, MA from 30 Aug to 2 Sep 2006. John went as our SGS Delegate. I went with the objective of trying to discover some new ideas we might pursue in understanding Obadiah Seeley's ancestors. I didn't find anything very helpful. The Association of Professional Genealogists allowed people to sign up for a consult with a professional. I signed up for two consults with British genealogists. Neither was able to offer useful hints.

John Seely and I had a meeting with highly respected genealogist Jerome Anderson in Boston. I believe Jerome descends from Obadiah Seeley's sister, Sarah. Jerome is convinced that the Obadiah Seeley of Stamford is the same Obadiah Seeley who was born in Birmingham in 1614. However, he provided no clues we didn't already have. He is making another trip to Salt Lake City this fall, and then he plans to write an article describing his research on Seeley ancestors in England. Jerome was supposed to speak at the 1992 SGS Reunion near Wethersfield, CT but he said he didn't make it because of "location" confusion. He agreed to speak at the 2007 SGS Reunion.

I focused my FGS Conference lecture attendance on the British ancestor's track. About all I came away with were a lot of references that were contained in the conference syllabus. Since there were so many presentations on the United Kingdom (including England), I plan to take the whole FGS Conference 2006 handout package to Abilene in May 2007 and leave it at the Seelye Research Center. It contains dozens of British sources that might be researched on the Seeley (or any English) surname.

Change 1 to the Seelye Research Center Filing System Pamphlet is in this Newsletter. Several hundred documents have been added to this pamphlet since the original was printed in May 2005. If you didn't get a copy during the 2005 SGS Reunion, and you would like to have a copy, let me know and I'll send you one with change 1 entered. The cost of printing and postage for this 21-page document is \$10.00. Make checks payable to the Seeley Genealogical Society. We plan to provide future updates as new documents are received and entered into the SRC.

Although final negotiations with the 2007 SGS Reunion hotel are still not complete at this writing, I have included a short information article in this newsletter. I don't think any of that information will change.

Please note the updated list of SGS Area Coordinators on page 16 of this issue. These volunteer members assist with recruiting new members in their area and support the Query Editor with researching queries.

I just received word that SGS LIFE member Pamela Turner has agreed, with Terry Tietjens' concurrence, to be the Librarian for the Seelye Research Center. Pamela lives in Colorado, so she will be visiting the Seelye Research infrequently. However, I needed someone with Pamela's outstanding judgment and initiative to relieve me of the responsibility of organizing the SRC documents. I hope the existing SRC filing system team and all SGS members will support and assist Pamela in her new responsibilities.

# Manuscript Calendar of the Consistory Court of Lichfield

As mentioned in the Research Outline, the published index of the Consistory court of Lichfield is known to have errors and omissions. The manuscript calendar is considered superior. The following Seeley wills and administrations were noted in the manuscript calendar, 1636-1670.

- Richard Seale of Newton Solney, administration, 17 Nov 1637 (#110).
- Daniel Seeley of Walsall, administration, 18 Sept 1663.
- Catherine Seale, Birmingham, will, 25 Apr 1665
- John Seale of Morley, will, 22 Sept 1666.
- John Seele, Horsley, will, 15 Oct 1667.

It is unclear whether Seale is a variant of Seeley or Sealey. There appears to have been an independent Seal family in the area. Nevertheless, the will of Catherine Seale should probably be examined in the future.

#### **Chancery Court Records**

If William Seeley or his son Obadiah owned land, it is possible that they were involved in litigation that was settled in the Chancery Court. Available indexes to this court include nothing regarding Obadiah Seeley. There are several references to the more common name of William Seeley, but it is unclear from the index whether they relate to William of Birmingham or some other William. The following references were found:

- William Seely (also Ceely), 1657, Bridges 4:70.
- William Seely, 14 Chas. I [1638/9], Exchequer Depositions by Commission, Term Mich. No. 2, vol. 2, group 4, page 14.
- William Seely Sr., of Rushmer, Suffolk, gentleman, 1651, aged 73, Chancery Depositions, Eliz. to Chas. I, Bdl. T10 Suit 11. [see PCC wills, cited above].
- William Selly, 1644, Town Depositions, bundle no. 701. Initial letter of suit: H.
- William Seeley, plaintiff v. George Tweeg, defendant, 1648, C 6/16/118.<sup>5</sup>

The fact that Obadiah Seeley is not mentioned in any of the indexed chancery suits makes it unlikely that any of the above documents would be useful in establishing the identity of the immigrant Obadiah Seeley, even if one of the suits did involve his father.

#### **Warwickshire Quarter Sessions Records**

These records are published and indexed in nine volumes. Each volume was examined. Only one Seeley was mentioned, Joseph Seeley of Coventry, Warwickshire, was a party to a lawsuit in 1664. There is no mention of William or Obadiah.

#### **Lichfield Diocese Records**

Birmingham lies in the Lichfield Diocese. Lichfield is in the adjacent county of Staffordshire. The Staffordshire Record Office has been contacted to see what Lichfield Diocesan records are available. They have yet to respond. [NOTE: On 23 August 2006, Mr. Stott reported via Email: "I have heard from the Staffordshire Record

Office, but the types of diocesan records they held did not appear to be helpful to our study of the family."]

#### **New Haven Colony Records**

Although New Haven and surrounding towns are now part of Connecticut, prior to 1662 they were a separate colony with records distinct from those of Connecticut. The records have been published in two large volumes. Obadiah was not found in either volume. Those who appeared in the indexes were Nathaniel, Lt. Robert, and "Sister" Seeley. Edward E. Atwater's *History of the Colony of New Haven* was also searched for Obadiah Seeley, but the results were negative.

#### **London Turner' Company Records**

In 1627/8, Obadiah Seeley, the son of William Seeley of Birmingham, was apprenticed to Nehemiah Wallington of London for the term of nine years to learn the turner's trade. Prior searches in the Turners' Company records through 1648 found no evidence that he was ever admitted to the London Turner's Guild. apprenticeship bindings of the company have been indexed o n а subscription website. www.originsnetwork.com. However, they make no further mention of Obadiah Seeley after his own binding to Wallington. This is significant because it shows that no apprentices were ever bound to Obadiah at a later period. The company court records are not indexed and would take many hours to research. Also examined was A. C. Stanley-Stone's The Worshipful Company of Turners of London, but nothing was found regarding Obadiah Seeley. It was noted that a John Wallington was frequently a company officer from 1604.

#### **Emigration Sources**

Most, if not all, of the surviving passenger lists for vessels embarking for colonial America that exist in the National Archives of Britain have been transcribed, indexed, and published. These are found in John Camden Hotten's *The Original Lists* and Peter Wilson Coldham's *Complete Book of Emigrants*. None of them mention Obadiah Seeley, although other Seeleys are mentioned.

# Connections Between Obadiah Seeley and The Bruen Family

William Seeley of Birmingham had a daughter Sarah who married Obadiah Bruen in Birmingham in 1633. They later settled in Gloucester, Massachusetts; Hartford, Connecticut; and Newark, New Jersey. Their removal to Newark occurred after the death of Obadiah Seeley at Stamford in 1657. If it could be shown that Obadiah Seeley had connections to Obadiah Bruen and his wife Sarah (presumably Obadiah Seeley's sister) in Gloucester or New London, it would greatly strengthen the circumstantial case for the identification of Obadiah Seeley as a son of William Seeley of Birmingham.

Several record groups were examined. Among them are the court records, land records, and the colony records of Massachusetts and Connecticut. Gloucester is in Essex County, Massachusetts. The deeds of Essex

County were searched, but neither the Bruens nor the Seeleys are mentioned. The same is true for the Quarterly Court records of Essex County. It was hoped that the two families might have been parties in a law suit, but nothing was found. Many immigrants to the New World found they needed assistance in taking care of legal matters in England. The records of Boston attorney Thomas Lechford and Suffolk County Recorder William Aspinwall contain hundreds of such cases. It was hoped that Obadiah Seeley and his sister Sarah Bruen would be found together in such a legal proceeding, but again the search was negative. Nor is there any mention of Obadiah in the records of the Governor and Company of the Massachusetts Bay.

Connecticut records were also searched. New London deed indexes contain numerous references to Obadiah Bruen. It was hoped that in one of these documents, Obadiah Seeley was a witness or was mentioned in some other capacity, such as one who owned adjacent property. However, a careful examination of these documents found no connections between the Bruen and Seeley families. Many of the deeds executed by the Bruens were dated after Seeley's death. The records of the Connecticut Colony and Caulkins' *History of New London* were also searched without finding any references to Obadiah Seeley.

# New England Connections Between Obadiah Seeley and James Cole

Nehemiah Wallington's friend James Cole settled in Hartford, Connecticut, about fifty miles from Obadiah Seeley's home in Stamford. If Wallington's apprentice was in fact the Obadiah Seeley who settled in Stamford, it is almost certain that Seeley and Cole knew each other in London through their mutual friend, Nehemiah Wallington. This section investigates the possibility that they also had some formal connections in New England. As with the Bruen research, it was hoped that these two immigrants might be found together in some record in this country. The published probate records of the early Connecticut Colony were searched to see if Cole and Seeley appeared together in any document. Perhaps Seeley or his children would be mentioned in Cole's will. Many references to James Cole of Hartford were found, but none for Obadiah Seeley. Similarly, the deeds of Hartford contain numerous references to James Cole and his lands, but nothing for Obadiah Seeley is mentioned. Nor are the two families mentioned together in the *Public* Records of the Colony of Connecticut in 15 volumes.

#### **Summary and Suggestions**

In this report, ten strategies were pursued. However, none produced any useful results. Two additional strategies should be considered. First, Karl Weiler (SGS Assistant Genealogist) has recently brought to my attention that letters between Nehemiah Wallington and his friend James Cle of Hartford are preserved in the British Library in London. This could be a significant discovery because it is likely that Wallington, Cole, and Seeley knew one another in London. It seems probable that there would be some reference to Obadiah Seeley

being in New England in one of these letters. That would be proof that Wallington's apprentice was in fact the New England immigrant of the same name. It is my understanding that Karl is attempting to obtain copies of the letters at his own expense. [JRS NOTE: Karl Weiler reported that he received 41 documents from the British Library on 4 August, 2006. These were letters written from 1635 to 1650 from James Cole to and from Nehemiah Wallington. They are a most interesting read, but no where in them do they mention Obadiah Seeley.]

Secondly, I could continue to urge Jerry Anderson to produce his long-awaited article on the Seeley ancestry. I have known Jerry for many years. He is a brilliant researcher. He has assured me that he has more evidence than we have found. It is possible that he has already discovered the Wallington-Cole letters in the British Library. The editors of *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register* have no plans to publish Jerry's article at present because he has yet to submit one. I am sure they would accept a completed article on the Seeley origins from Jerry Anderson

- Hotel Group rate for SGS is: \$99 for 2 people, \$109 for 3, and \$119 for 4, all plus (currently) 12% tax per

County Home Cemetery isn't in Austinburg (a part of Brookfield Township, Tioga Co., PA) and Gene can't find Samuel listed in the other Austinburg cemeteries.

I found Samuel listed in the 1850-1880 censuses for Brookfield, always in a household headed by a family member – with his father Luman in 1850, with his brother Bradley in 1860 and 1870 and with his brother Harvey in 1880. The 1880 census verifies that he is Harvey's brother and also states that he is single. I also found an online listing for the Tioga County Home Cemetery near Wellsboro but Samuel is not listed. If you have other information on Samuel Seeley, SGS #2477, let me know.

**Query 0611-1** Submitted by Randy Baxter (<a href="mailto:rbaxter@exchange.FULLERTON.EDU">rbaxter@exchange.FULLERTON.EDU</a>)

Randy contacted Chris Havnar about **John Franklin Seelye** of Felton, CA. John Franklin's son Raymond married Randy's great-great-aunt. Randy is in touch with some of John Franklin's descendants in the Bay Area who would like to know more about that side of their family.

According to Randy, Raymond was the fourth and last surviving child of John Franklin Seelye (b. Aug. 14, 1864), a gambler, roamer and lumberman who had worked for a time at a mill in Felton. John Seelye's first wife, Raymond's mother Gertrude Fumigalli died in childbirth in about 1901. John soon either remarried or merely lived with a "rich lady" nicknamed Becky, whom Raymond remembered fondly. By about 1915, Becky was out of the picture, and Raymond had a new stepmother, Arabella "Cora" Hough (b. Sept. 25, 1870). The family remained in Felton until the lumber mill closed shortly after the Great War (WWI), when they moved to Mayfield, San Mateo County, near the university town of Palo Alto. A staunch Protestant, John refused to meet Raymond's second wife Flora Dern or attend the wedding, since she was Roman Catholic. Flora never did meet her father-in-law, who died of stomach cancer at age 64 on Nov. 5, 1928.

**SGS Response:** Chris directed Randy to the SGS website where the text of John Franklin Seelye's death certificate is located. It shows that John was born in Little Falls, MN to Dustin F. Seelye and Georgiana Lyman of Nova Scotia. Chris also had a copy of the obituary of Hugh Seelye who is a brother of Raymond. That shows that there were also two sisters, Lila M. Robinson of San Francisco and Ethel Ordway of Winton, CA.

Upon further investigation I found in the 1860 census of Little Falls, Morrison, MN:

FD Seelye, age 37, b. New Brunswick, labourer and

his wife Georgiana, age 32, also b. NB.
Then in the 1870 census of Santa Cruz, CA:
Seelye, Farnum D., age 45, b. NB
Georgiana, age 43, b. NB
Deborah L., age 9, b. MN

John F., age 6, b. MN

In 1880 the family is in San Lorenzo, Santa Cruz, CA. Farnum is working as a lumberman and says he and his parents were all b. in NB as were Georgiana and her parents. Deborah L is now going by the name Latetia. By 1910 Latetia is married to JW Cunningham, she has 4 children, and her father, Farnum D., now age 85 and a widower is living with her. He says he immigrated to the US in 1850.

An index to the Mountain Echo, a Santa Cruz paper shows Farnum's name as Farnum Duston Seelye.

The SGS CD-Rom has 2 entries. One is for Farnum (parents unknown) married to Georgina Hamlin and the other is for Dustin F., son of Henry Seelye, SGS #2307 and Maria Clinch. Henry is in the 8<sup>th</sup> generation from Robert, a son of Stuart R Seelye. Stuart's father was a Loyalist and moved the family to St John, New Brunswick in 1783.

**Query 0611-2** Submitted by Jean Racicot (isidore01@sympatico.ca)

Jean is looking for the ancestry of **Harley Seely** b. 10 June 1829 in Quebec. Harley married Josephine Coutu/Couture (b. abt 1842) 15 December 1868 in Dunham, Quebec. This was a catholic marriage after their marriage 9 years earlier under a protestant minister. They married twice so their children could have a choice of religion. Josephine died 11 Jan. 1898, age 56, buried in Dunham. Jean knows of 2 children. Josephine Seeley married Joseph Poirier 9 Nov. 1885 in Dunham. Ezra Seeley was b. 27 Dec. 1864 and died 3 December 1937. His wife was probably Virginia Robillard. Harley may have had a brother named Ezra. Jean suggests that Ezra Seeley, SGS #865 may be the father of Harley.

SGS Response: The Seventh Generation book, Nathaniel section, page 46 and note at the bottom of page 45, indicates some confusion/uncertainty about the ancestry of Ezra D Seeley, SGS# 865. It doesn't look to me like he is the father of Harley as Jean suggests.

Harley is listed as Harley Saley in the 1881 census of Dunham, Mississquoi, Quebec. He is shown as age 54, married, of Irish descent, and living in the home of Micheal Vail. No other members of Harley's family are listed. I also found a reference in the same census to Ezra Seeley, age 17,of Irish origin, living in the home of Luciano Whitcomb, also in Dunham, no other Seeleys present in the household.

Can anyone identify Harley's parents or offer suggestions to Jean?

Can anyone help identify **James W. Cilley/Seeley**, etc or find further evidence linking James to Jane Collins in NY State? Remember to cite the query number in your response.

Herman has a relative named Dave Bowser. Herman says Dave's grandfather was **Orly Seelye** of Conneautville, PA. Orly had 2 brothers, names unknown, and was married to Margaret Carr. Orly and Margaret had 4 sons who moved to Southern CA and Oregon. Herman wonders what Orly's origins are.

**SGS Response:** I found the 4 sons of Orlando L Seeley and Margaret Carr on the SGS CD-ROM:

Glenn Carr Seeley b. 30 MAY 1884 in CA , d. 13 MAY 1964 , wife: Hannah \_\_\_\_\_

Howard Seeley b. 13 NOV 1888 in CA , d. 13 AUG 1965 m. 13 NOV 1920 Los Angeles CA Whittier ? to Taber, Edna who was b. 13 MAR 1894 in Los Angeles CA Whittier

Andrew Ross Seeley b. 5 JUN 1892 Los Angeles CA Whittier d. 9 JUL 1964 Riverside, CA, Corona, married Lois H. b. ca 1894

Orlando Lawrence b. 15 JAN 1894 CA d. 16 JAN 1976 Rive, CA Perris unmarried

Andrew Ross Seeley had 2 daughters, Anita and Betty. Betty married a Bowser and I suppose she is Dave's mother. There are death certificates for all the brothers in CA and Betty Bowser gave the details on at least 2 of them.

Orlando appears in the 1900 census for Los Angeles, age 43, born Dec 1846 (should read 1856) in PA as were his parents. He is listed with his wife Margaret age 38, born Nov 1861 in PA and the 4 sons listed above.

I found Orlando with his parents in the 1860 census of Spring, Crawford, PA. His father is William Seely, age 43, b. NY, a farmer, his mother is Adaline, age 42, b. PA and the children are Martha, age 15, Andrew age 13, Eliza, age 9, Justin, age 5, Orlando, age 3 and Laura, age 4 mos.. Adaline is a widow in the 1870 census and Martha is listed as Mattie, Eliza as Addie, Justin is listed as WJ and Laura is Flora M., Orlando and Andrew as before. Adlaine is also with Andrew, Orlando and Laura in the 1880 census for Spring. That census states that Adeline's parents were born in Ireland. Seely is spelled Seelye in 1850, Seely in 1860 and 1870, Seelye in 1880 and Seeley in 1900.

I also found Margaret Carr in the 1870 census of Conneautville, Crawford, PA. Her father is Levant Carr, age 30, b. NY, a wagon maker, her mother is Maria, age

32, B. PA, and the children are Julia, 15, Jacob, 14, Bradford, 11, Margaret, 9, Mary, 6, Minnie, 4 and Maria, 1, all b. PA. By 1880 3 more children are born, Beatrice, age 10 (or maybe she's the same as Maria), Donna, age 8 and Marshall, age 2. Margaret is called Maggie and is a schoolteacher.

Returning to the SGS CD-ROM it shows:

William Daniel Seely b. 11 AUG 1818 Crawford, PA, Springboro d. 20 JUL 1869 m. bef 1846 Patterson, Adaline who was b. 24 JUN 1819 and d. 7 JUL 1897 William's parents: Father: Seeley, Schubel, Mother: Moon, Martha

SGS #2486\* Schubel/Shuble Seelye (b 25 May 1793; d 12 Jan 1842, Springboro, PA) m about Jul 1812, Martha Moon.

Schubel's father is SGS # 914 Justus Seelye (7) (David; Justus; John; Benjamin; Nathaniel; Robert) (b 26 Apr 1771; d 7 Dec 1832, Queensbury, NY, "died in the West") m 19 Oct 1790, Elizabeth Fuller (d 2 Dec 1832, Queensbury, NY) Daughter of John/Ebenezer Fuller. Justus resided Queensbury, NY.

**Query 0611-5** Submitted by Paul Seeley (paul.seeley@gm.com)

Paul Seeley contacted us about researching his ancestors in MI. His great grandfather (Charles Grove Seeley) was a railroad engineer from Bay City, MI. Tracing Paul's family back through the census I found that he is descended from Stephen J Seeley, SGS # 1975 through his son Alanson. However in sending information to Paul I noticed that there is a note on page 7 of SGS Volume 3 (Nathaniel section) about the age discrepancy between Stephen Seeley SGS #612 (father of Stephen J.) and his wife Ruth Odell/O'Dell. She is possibly 15 years older than Stephen and he would have become a father at the age of 14 or 15 if he was born shortly before his baptism in 1761 and his first child was born about 1775. So this guery is about what information we have about this marriage and about possible birthdates for Stephen Seeley and Ruth Odell.

Additionally, the 1860 census for Forest, Genesee, MI shows that Alanson Seely, age 34 was b. in IN. His brothers Judson, age 45 and Chauncey, age 43 were b. in OH, Norice O, age 32 was b. in IN and Mark, age 30, was b. in KY. So it looks like the family went to Ohio first, then Indiana, then Kentucky and finally Michigan. If Mark was 30 in 1860 they obviously didn't leave KY until after he was born in 1830. It looks like our note about Stephen J. Seeley's residency on page 7 should be amended.

SGS Response: Kathie Olsen responded as follows. "In my opinion, both of their births are not computed correctly. The age spread is unusual and also the age of Stephen at the birth of the first child is very young. His baptism is listed as 1761 (maybe this is not the correct date) but he could have been born several years earlier. (Maybe the preacher only came sporadically.) Her baptism date is 1753. Her father died in 1756 with two small children at age 25 (meaning he was born in 1731) so she probably wasn't born as early as 1746 even

though her death information says she was 94 at her death in 1840. She was living with a granddaughter at the time of her death. One reason previous researchers gave for believing these two individuals were married to one another is that the first two children were named Eunice and Gershom, the names of Ruth O'Dell's parents. On the second question, the History of Genesee Co. Michigan states, "...they came in the fall of 1836, residing in Pontiac until 1838 when they removed to Genesee. Settled in Forest Township in July, 1841." I will make this correction to the 7th Generation Book note on page 7."

Marilyn has been searching for **Adelia Seeley** for more than fifteen years. She was born 15 Jan. 1823. She died 18 Jan 1887 in Rockstream, New York. According to the census she was born in Seneca, Cayuga County. About 1840 she married William Jones and they lived in Rockstream, NY until their deaths. Their children: Sarah Ann 1841, Archibald 1842, Eliza 1850. Joseph 1851, Charlotte 1852, William 1857, Frank 1859, Fred Starr 1865.

SGS Response: Rock Stream is in the southern part of the township of Starkey, Yates County. Adelia appears with her husband William Jones in each US and state census for Starkey, Yates, NY from 1845- 1880, identified as Adelia, A, Addelia and Delia. According to the various census records her children are Sarah A. born 1839/40, Archabald born 1842/3, Joseph born 1845, Mariah born 1848 (died before 1860), Eliza born 1850, Charlotte born 1852, Timothy born after 1850 census listed in 1855 state census and died before 1860 census, William Jr (Willie) born 1854, Franklin (Frank) born 1857, a daughter identified as "A" born 1859 and died before 1865, and Frederick (Fred) born 1867. In Cleveland's History and Directory of Yates County the wife of William Jones is identified as Delia Seeley. Adelia and her birthdate and husband are listed on our CD-ROM with no other details. William Jones is the son of Timothy Jones, originally from Rockland County, NY. The Jones family moved to Yates County in 1835. Let me know if you have other information or research suggestions.

Name: **Hannah Seeley** or Seelye. Some records (unverified) show first name as Katherine.

First (only) verifiable info: Baptismal record December 28, 1809, of four of her children in Amherstburg, Essex County, Ontario, Canada, St John the Baptist Church. On the baptismal record, she signed her named clearly Hannah Seelye. Her husband's name: Thomas Lidwill

Children's names: Elizabeth, Hannah, Abner, Mary, Robert, Thomas Jefferson, Julie, born in time period 1797-1810. Some were born in New York state; the last in Canada; the first (unverified) in Ireland.

Final record: She died in Amherstburg, Essex County, Ontario April 15, 1813, identified only as wife of Lidwill in the church record of her death.

Other information: Unverified information says she was "an English Catholic lady". Her husband, Thomas Lidwill, was from Ireland. The family was in New York state by about 1800, one son born there (in Troy) in 1808, they were in Essex County, Ontario, Canada by December 1809.

We will publish an update to your original query which may lead to even more information. One more name, date or place may be the key to connecting your line to another. Your query will also be posted on our website. Make sure we have your current email and normal address – sometimes we get information several months after publication.

#### **HOW TO ANSWER A QUERY**

If you have information to share on any queries, current or from past issues, send it to the query submitter and also to Linda Crocker, Query Editor. Please include the Query Number, preferably in the subject line of your email. Remember to cite your sources.

#### What's new in queries this quarter?

I continue to be amazed at the information you can find if you are persistent in searching the census records. Luckily some of the Seeleys have interesting (uncommon) first names. Sometimes I can find someone who 'isn't there' by searching for a first name in a location where I think they 'ought' to be. If I'm lucky they turn up. Often their surname has been mis-read or incorrectly indexed. Of course I wish they had recorded all the names of family members before 1850; maybe then I could find my Brick Wall. I was also able to help a couple of new 'cousins' find their links to the family: Paul Seeley (see Query 0611-5 above) and Andy Young who descends from Lyman Seeley, a son of Daniel J. Seeley, SGS #3440, a 7<sup>th</sup> generation descendant of Obadiah.
