Plans Taking Shape for 2015 SGS International Reunion

The 2015 Reunion Planning Committee recently met in Abilene, Kan., to plan our next reunion. The reunion will be held July 27-29, 2015, in Abilene. Since this is the 50th anniversary of the founding of SGS, "Our Golden Anniversary 1965-2015" has been chosen as the theme. The reunion will conclude on Wednesday, and the Wild Bill Hickok PRCA Rodeo and Central Kansas Free Fair and Parade will begin on Thursday, July 30. Abilene was proclaimed by Smithsonian Magazine in 2013 as one of the top twenty small-town vacation destinations in America. The reunion will be a wonderful opportunity to share Abilene and its exciting environment with your family.

There will be a meeting of elected and appointed officers prior to the reunion on Sunday evening, July 26, at 6:00 p.m. at the Seelye Research Center.

The reunion itself will begin on Monday, July 27, at 8:00 a.m. on the grounds of the Seelye Mansion with registration and a delicious breakfast. Terry Tietjens will make his great sweet rolls for the breakfast. There will also be a tree-planting ceremony to commemorate the 50th anniversary of SGS. Tours of the Seelye Mansion and the Seelye Research Center will begin at 10:00 am. Tours of Abilene and shuttles to the Dickinson County Heritage Center and Carousel and the Eisenhower Center will leave

the Mansion at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Box lunches will be available. At 5:00 p.m., dinner will be served at the Hitching Post restaurant, followed by a train ride on the famous Abilene and Smoky Valley Railroad steam train.

On Tuesday, July 28, the Conference will convene at the Abilene Civic Center (the Historic Union Pacific Depot)

I thank all the dedicated officers and committee members in attendance. It is a big sacrifice on the part of all of them. Unfortunately, several others were not able to join us and were excused.

The 2015 Reunion Planning Committee met on July 17, 2014. The dates are set (July 27-29, 2015), the place is set (Abilene, Kan.), the theme is set (Our Golden Anniversary: 1965-2015), and we hope you are set to join us! It will be a very memorable gathering. A separate article in this

On July 18, 2014, the elected and appointed officers of SGS met for the annual board meeting. The minutes of this meeting are in this Newsletter.

As an organization, we are in the precarious position of having spent more money than we have taken in during the last several years. SGS membership has also declined during the same period. Both of these items are of great concern to elected and appointed officers. Much discussion centered on these two dilemmas. If you have any insight that might help SGS resolve these issues, please contact me.

I have appointed a nominating committee consisting of Jesse Crisler (chair), Camille Seeley Bell, and Marie Seelye and thank them for their willingness to serve. This committee is charged with locating nominees for SGS offices and arranging for the election of officers. Since I will not be running for reelection in 2015, a candidate for President is needed as well as for Secretary. Please contact one of the committee members if you are willing to serve.

SGS has at last been granted Title 501(c)(3) status. We are now considered a private operating foundation. The effective date of exemption is March 1, 1965. All contributions to SGS are deductible under Section 170 of the Code. A donor can use "bank records (such as a cancelled check) or a written communication from the private foundation" to verify contributions. If the donation is over \$250.00, a written communication is required. SGS will send receipts for all donations over \$250.00. Some travel expenses by officers are also deductible. Please check with Sally Seeley, SGS Treasurer, if you need a receipt for tax purposes.

The 2013 Reunion Souvenir Books have been mailed. If you ordered and paid for a book but did not receive one, please contact me immediately. There are also a few extra books; if you did not order one but would like one, please get in touch with me. The books cost \$30.00, including postage. The updated Constitution appears there along with much other important material concerning SGS as well as speeches, presentations, and pictures galore from the 2013 reunion in Grand Rapids, Mich.

I thank all who give time or money to support the Seeley Genealogical Society. It is an amazing volunteer organization.

Original SGS Research Donated to Seelye Research Center

Esther L. Walter recently donated a cache of her research to SGS, including 12 notebooks charting descendants of Robert and Obadiah Seeley through eleven generations,

two file boxes of her correspondence with various Seeleys, and other miscellaneous papers.

A member of SGS since 1965, Esther was a mainstay during the Society's fledgling years. She worked closely with SGS founder Garner Osborn to locate Seeleys around the nation; she became contributing editor of the SGS Newsletter in 1967; when Garner, then in failing health, decided to retire from SGS, he gave his own Seeley records to Esther; using Garner's material and the fruit of her own indefatigable research, Esther wrote the first edition of the descendants of Robert Seelev.

Generations One through Five, in 1977; and she helped organize and then presided over the Society's first reunion


emerged from retirement to travel to Salt Lake City to speak at the sixth reunion in 1995. Meanwhile, fire damaged Esther's in Allenspark, home

> unfortunately, a few pages of some notebooks also suffered damage at that time. Following the fire, Don Eff, then president of SGS, transferred Esther's records to Denver for safekeeping.

A few years later, the next president of the Society, Bob Cox, and his wife, Marianne, spent a week in Allenspark copying all of Esther's irreplaceable notebooks, which had since been returned to her from Denver; those copies have for years been available for use at the Seelye Research Center in Abilene, Kan. Now Esther's original records for the first time are also housed in the SRC, where they will eventually be

on display.

SGS owes a great debt to Esther for her work in compiling this splendid record of research over many vears.

Seelye Research Center Adapts New Mission Statement

During the last SGS board meeting, held July 18, 2014, the Executive Board accepted the SRC mission statement and acquisition policy printed below as directional documents for the SRC.

Seelye Research Center Mission Statement

The mission of the Seelye Research Center (SRC) is to preserve the genealogical legacy of the Seeley name (of any spelling), to house artifacts related to the Seeley surname, and to share information acquired with the public in accordance with current privacy protection policies. To accomplish this mission, the SRC collects and preserves any and all genealogical information and artifacts related to the Seeley surname with the intent of expanding the knowledge of the Seeley name and legacy. Items accepted by the SRC will be handled in accordance with the SGS acquisition policy.

Seelye Research Center Acquisition Policy

All items to be included in the Seelye Research Center (SRC) will be selected with the following questions in mind:

- How does the item further knowledge of the Seeley family?
 - Does it add to information the SRC already has, or is it new information?
 - Does it highlight a special individual within the extended Seeley family?
 - Is it of overall historical value to the furthering of genealogical knowledge?
- What is the condition of the item?
 - Will it require extra effort to repair or preserve the item for inclusion in the SRC?
 - Could it be a detriment to the rest of the collection?
- Is there a history attached to the item?



Does the item include its provenance?

General Rules of Acceptance

- 1. Items accepted into the SRC must have a connection to the Seeley name (any spelling).
- 2. Items must be in good condition with a minimal amount of damage.
- 3. Large collections must be approved by the SGS board before acquisition by the SRC.
- 4. Digital items may be accepted but must be in a preapproved format.
- 5. All items accepted into the SRC will become the property of the SRC and the SGS.
- 6. Any discrepancies regarding the inclusion of an item into the SRC will be decided upon by the board.

Seelye Research Center Update

The week of July 14 saw the filing team hard at work at the Seelye Research Center (SRC) in Abilene, Kan. Our focus was an attempt to complete the filing of the boxes of materials donated by the family of John R. Seely, who passed away a few years ago.

When we arrived this year, we had six boxes filled with binders and individual files; when we left, we had one box

with submitter file documents, information that John used to establish the SGS ancestor database.

I would like to give special recognition to Carol Haddon and Ruthetta Seelye Hansen for their hard work. Carol spent her entire time combining John's files of submitter documents with copies already in the SRC. This entailed a page-by-page comparison to ensure that SRC files are as complete as possible. Ruthetta worked on two boxes of binders of John's personal family documents to ensure that the set in the SRC is complete and, where possible, con-

tains original source documents.

Work this year also included filing documents received at the SRC since our last visit. The majority of these items were newsletters and treasurer's files from Sally Seeley. These will be listed as "Change 7" in the SRC Document Index

Probably the most important news concerning the SRC is the approval by the board of a mission statement and acquisition policy, both of which can be found in a separate article in this newsletter. I thought these documents were necessary to help guide the direction and focus of the SRC, not just for current members but for future members as well.

The work on the descendants of the 8th-generation index continues. The index currently contains 354 number files with 14,789 lines of data. There have also been fourteen new number files added since the last reunion in Grand Rapids, Mich.; this is directly related to the work of Linda Crocker and Chris Havnar.



His grandfather, Casper Frank Lampman, worked for William Seeley in the sawmill and lumber yard on North Plain Rd, Housatonic, Berkshire, MA, in the 1920s. Don is looking for the house where his mother was born on North Plain Rd. It is near the Seeley house.

Don remembers his mother, Ruth, telling a story about the mill and a fire there when she was about three or four years old. Ruth woke in the night crying, waking her father and mother. They discovered that the mill was on fire. When "Mr. Seeley" heard that Don's mother had awakened everyone and the mill was saved, he gave her a new pair of shoes. Most kids did not wear shoes, but since Ruth had a club foot, she had to wear them. There were seven children in the family, so shoes were hard to come by.

A Great Barrington directory shows C. Frank Lampman living just across North Plain Road from William C. Seeley, lumber dealer.

Don would like to have a picture of the mill or the Seeley house on North Plain Rd to help him locate the Lampman house.

SGS Response: The 7th Generation Families of Nathaniel Seeley, p. 83, shows several children for Sheldon Seeley, SGS# 1086c, by his first and second wives (no name for first wife, Lola for second wife) but no information on the children's spouses or that they had children. There is no death information for Sheldon. We had previously identified wives and children for two of Sheldon's children by his first wife—SGS# 2752, John Seeley, and SGS# 2753, Benjamin Seeley. By Sheldon's second wife, Lola, we had 2 children-SGS# 2755, Alexander Seeley, b. abt. 1847, NY, and SGS# 2756, Margaret Seeley, b. Mar 1850, Machias, Cattaraugus, NY. Samantha's line is George William, Nehemiah Ezekiel, John Calvin, Ezekiel A. (SGS# 3274), Ezekiel, Ezekiel, Obadiah, Obadiah, Obadiah, Obadiah. Ezekiel (SGS# 1431), father of Ezekiel A., was b. 12 Oct 1760, Stamford, CT, and d. 7 Jun 1839, Blissville, New Brunswick. He served with the King's American Regiment and was a prisoner of war in 1781. He received land grant #237 in 1788. So he was one of the Loyalists who went to New Brunswick at the end of the Revolutionary War. His father Ezekiel was also a Loyalist.

When this information was sent to Samantha, she replied with information on the descendants of George William. These folks will all be entered into the growing SGS Ancestor File. She also included the photo of Nehemiah Ezekiel holding baby George at the bottom left of this page.
